
### **New Staff**

Tyler James Arts

On November 14, 2018, the Arts Family experienced the most painful moment in their lives. Their son and brother, Tyler James Arts, passed away in a car accident just before his 18th birthday.

In the local Village Voice, the family recently shared,

"It has been said that it takes a village to raise a child. Although that may be true, I can tell you beyond a shadow of a doubt that it takes a village to bury one."

They also expressed "a very humble thank you to all who donated to the GoFundMe page, ate a number 7 burger at the Joker's Crown, bought a sweatshirt or bracelet, showed up to a very powerful Memorial hockey game and presentation put on by the Ingersoll Minor Hockey Association or donated to the Oxford Community

Foundation directly, all of this keeps the Legacy of Tyler James Arts alive. There are truly no words powerful enough to express how important that is to all of us. Tyler's memory and our love for him will always be present in this community through everyone that has touched his life and because of how he touched ours."

Because of the community's amazing support, Tyler's parents, Rick and Dale and his siblings, Samantha, Jamie, Scott and Jennifer were able to set up the Tyler Arts Fund at OCF.

Participating in sports has always been a significant part of the Arts family life. "Sports helped me and helped Tyler get through our high school years," Rick says." The family thought it fitting to designate grants in Tyler's memory to families with financial challenges, to make it possible for youth to participate in hockey. They're also setting up two spirit

awards recognizing sportsmanship and leadership, one to be awarded to a local hockey player and a second bursary to go to a high school athlete.

Through OCF and grants from the fund, Tyler's spirit and the way he lived his life, full of love and kindness will be remembered always.
