Message from the Board Chair



I wish to thank the Membership for the honour of representing you as the President of the Oxford Community Foundation. I would also like to thank Don Taylor as Past President and the Board of Directors for their support over the last year. I can assure you, there is a steep learning curve in assuming this role.

Over the last year, I have had the privilege of visiting all 8 Municipalities, and the County Council of Oxford, to raise awareness of OCF and create contacts. OCF gained support for the Mayor's Roast and for the Foundation hosting the 2012 Warden's Golf Tournament.

I'm pleased to report I was well received by all Councils, and the support of the Mayor's, their Councils, and Staff for the Mayors Roast in November ensured an overwhelming success. A special thank you to the Roasters! I am pleased to announce that the Oxford Community Foundation was able to net over \$15,000 from the Mayors Roast and has been granted permission to host the Warden's Golf Tournament on June 20th of 2012

This has been a very exciting year to be President since I was able to watch the ground work provided by my predecessors come to fruition and our Endowments grow from \$350,000 at the end of 2010 to just over \$700,000 at the end of 2011!

One of the goals the Board set for itself over the last year was to develop a higher profile in the community. I believe this has occurred through our media releases, visits to the Councils and the announcement in 2011 from the London Community Foundation of two grants that would be given out in 2012 by the Oxford Community Foundation in Oxford County. The first fund was the interest from the 2001 Canada Games created from the surplus of these games and since Oxford hosted a number of these events, \$17,400 was allocated to Oxford County. The other fund held by London Community Foundation is the Harvey and Erma Beaty Fund.

I'm pleased to announce that Cold Spring Farms, a member of the Maple Leaf Family has revisited their funding policy, and opened up granting to Oxford County once again and have asked the Oxford Community Foundation to vet these grant applications.

DONOR ADVISED FUND

With a minimum donation of \$50,000, a donor or designate may be involved in the decision making process regarding the disbursement of the interest from their funds. These funds may be either anonymous or named.

FIELD OF INTEREST FUND

With a minimum donation of \$25,000, a donor may establish their own field of interest fund. Donors may designate the nature of the causes to be supported by their fund. These funds may either be anonymous or named.

COMMUNITY FUND

This fund accepts donations, large or small, and is designed to meet the changing needs of the County. Each year, through an application process, the Board selects causes to be supported by the monies generated by this fund. OPERATING FUND

This fund is used to support the day to day operation of the Foundation. Normally, donations under \$2,500 are directed to this fund.

This frees the named charity from the responsibility of managing their fund and allows them to take advantage of the combined investment power of our Foundation. The monies currently generated through this type of fund are directed back to the named charity.
